

## Submit a Bulk Claim (SaBC) goes live 4 February

The LAA has announced that the Submit a Bulk Claim (SaBC) service will go live on **4 February** following the final stages of digital testing. Unlike other systems restored following the cyber-attack, this is a brand new service, although retaining some similar functionalities to the previous CWA system.

You will need to use SaBC to upload January submission, **by 17 February**. The LAA says this early deadline is to allow the processing time required to ensure payments are made on time at the start of March. No further changes to the standard monthly deadline of the 20<sup>th</sup> are expected in 2026.

Monthly submissions via the contingency process ends on 20 January, and all future submissions must be via SaBC.

To guide users through the new service and ensure they are ready to submit through SaBC the LAA have prepared:
